


We focussed on keeping our accommodation and support safe and consistent for our companions. This was not always easy, but we are proud to have kept those core services running. We have never closed our doors to companions.

With a rapid drop in our income and increased demand for support from many of our companions we launched an emergency appeal in 2020. We were amazed by our supporters' generosity and by the extra donations we received from charitable trusts and individuals in particular. Thanks to everyone who gave we go into 2021 in a strong position to keep helping homeless people.

The following figures are from our accounts for our financial year running from 1 September 2019 to 31 August 2020.

Our income



Our total income was £928,026 an increase of 6% on our previous year.


This increase mostly came from a higher level of donations and legacies from individuals.

We retain reserves of three months' running costs. We also have reserves put aside with the aim of increasing our training offer and expanding our accommodation.

Our spending

Our total spending was £772,499.

This is slightly lower than our spending in the previous financial year, which was £793,459. That decrease reflects the caution which we exercised in 2020.



LOOKING AHEAD

We now want to increase the number of people who get into employment and move into their own home. We are going to offer more training and education programmes and we are hoping to expand our accommodation.


We are making all of our plans with COVID-19 in mind. We have developed our online sales so our companions can keep working when our store is closed. We are also doing more to help companions to learn IT skills and to help them to access learning online. Thank you to everyone who has shopped online with us and to supporters who have helped us to build a new Progression Hub in our community building.

In early 2021 we also launched our Resettlement Support Fund. This gives former rough sleepers who have been temporarily staying in hotels the chance to get everything they need to move into their own accommodation at no cost to them. We are pleased to use our resources to help this group of people out of homelessness for good.

After leaving a hotel, temporary accommodation, and moving into a housing association flat with nothing, Emmaus helped make it begin to look like a home. Thank you for the household items, I was pleasantly surprised how good quality they was.
