SOLIDARITY EVENTS 2023:


We are very excited to announce our upcoming fundraising events for 2023!

MARK'S STORY:

One of our Companions, Mark, recently gained new employment as a forklift driver and will be moving on from Emmaus SLC. Mark enrolled on a 4-day course to gain the required qualifications to be employed as a forklift driver which was his job prior to joining Emmaus. He was able to join this course thanks to our previously mentioned Aviva fund and the Companion Training Fund provided by Emmaus UK.

Mark will be staying at Emmaus for the next 3 months whilst he settles into his new job before moving on from us. We are always happy to see our Companions improve their confidence and skillset to move on from us. We wish Mark the best in moving on with his life.

OUR CROYDON COMMUNITY HOMES LEARNS TO COOK:

We have been running our 'cooking with confidence' course taking place in our two Croydon Community homes. The course is funded by Croydon Relief in Need and entails a staff member working 18 hours a week to teach 2 Companions on budgeting, cooking, and food safety & hygiene in a course which lasts 6 weeks. We are running this course for a year and hope most of our Companions will take part.

Having the skills and confidence needed to be able to prepare nutritious and cheap meals is an essential skill for our Companions to help move on successfully. By developing these skills in a safe place of learning to do this, our Companions have found a new enjoyment from being able to cook what they always wanted to.

LARGE RISE SEEN IN ROUGH SLEEPING THROUGH THE LAST YEAR IN LONDON:

The rise in rough sleeping can be seen through the data produced by the Greater London Authority via CHAIN. This is a secure database where all people found rough sleeping are recorded, as not all rough sleepers are found the amount is most likely higher. There is concerning news in the last year that there has been a huge jump in people found bedded down on the streets. These are the figures for the two Boroughs Emmaus SLC operate Community homes:

- In the last year, 623 people were found rough sleeping in Lambeth, a rise of 42% since 2021-22.
- In the last year, 373 people were found rough sleeping in Croydon, a rise of 36% since 2021-22.

No one should be in a situation where they are forced to rough sleep and we are proud that Emmaus is here to help people who are facing and experiencing homelessness to find a home, develop their skills, and move on.
